Copper Valley Electric Association's Board of Directors is committed to enriching the educational experience of your local students and supporting future members of the Cooperative.

In addition to educational scholarships for graduating seniors, this year CVEA is excited to provide youth in our service area the opportunity to attend the 2008 Idaho Youth Rally. One high school student in each district will be awarded scholarships to attend a week-long summer camp at Albertson College in Caldwell, Idaho.

Youth Rally provides challenging opportunities for learning and making new friends. Opportunities which pay dividends to the Cooperative in the form of future leadership and to the students in the form of possible scholarships.

The Idaho Consumer-owned Utilities Association provides a one-week rural electric/leadership program to high school sophomores and juniors. It is six days filled with fun and learning about consumer-owned electric utilities, developing leadership skills and self-esteem, meeting area students and building lasting relationships with other students from Alaska, Oregon, Idaho and Wyoming.

It also includes social activities like swimming, dancing, bowling and roller-skating to name just a few. Through these activities attendees learn about teamwork, cooperation and communication. They learn how to be a leader and receive convincing warnings on the dangers of gangs, drugs, and alcohol abuse. They learn skills that will be applied throughout their life.

The Rally is also a great opportunity for our young people to learn the history of the Rural Electrification Program, how cooperatives were formed, what decisions need to be made by board members and how these decisions can impact the rates paid by consumers.

They will also learn about different electric utilities, the basics of electricity, electrical safety, future energy needs and the role our electric company plays in the community.

The Rally holds additional opportunities for participants as well. ICUA will award scholarships to outstanding rally participants.

Approximately 20 scholarships are awarded each year, ranging from \$200 to \$600 each. In addition, students are selected by a vote of their peers to return to Idaho as a student director for the following year. One student director is chosen for Alaska.


While at the Rally, students are interviewed and observed for participation and leadership qualities. One student is selected to represent the state of Alaska on the NRECA Youth Leadership Council. This student will first travel to Washington, D.C., to participate in the NRECA Youth Tour the following June. After that, the student will begin his or her term on the council.

Valdez student Alicia Kupczyk was selected at the 2004 Youth Rally to be the 2005-2006 NRECA Youth Leadership Council Delegate for Alaska. She was selected based on the leadership and enthusiasm she demonstrated at the Rally. According to Alicia, "The rally is definitely a great opportunity! You learn so much about electricity."

This scholarship program is being offered to students of Copper Valley Electric's customers. Students that are in their sophomore or junior year of high school are eligible to apply. The 2008 Rally will be held July 7-12, 2008 at Albertson College in Caldwell, Idaho.

CVEA will pay all costs, including transportation, for the student selected in each district. A chaperon will accompany students and all travel arrangements and accommodations will be made by a Youth Rally Coordinator.

Students wishing to participate must submit an application.
