For those of you who have never visited the website, cvea.org is truly packed with useful information and now it's easier than ever to access. You can access information several ways and information has been categorized to make it helpful to the user.

Did you know you can access your CVEA account, find out information specific to you, and pay your bill online?

You can....There are several ways to do this including clicking any my account button or by clicking the bill pay button on the home page.

It only takes a few minutes to set up an account and then you simply enter your email address and password.

It will take you to your current bill where you can pay from your checking account or by debit card.

You can also see your billing and payment history and view charts outlining your specific usage and costs. All of this information can help you manage your account.

If you have questions about how your cooperative does business, check out the 'About Us' link. Here you will find CVEA's Annual Reports, Bylaws, Tariff, information about each of CVEA's power plants, and more.

You can also look for job opportunities and contact CVEA Board and Staff members.

Visit the 'Community Support' page to find out how you can participate in your cooperative, learn about the CVEA Scholarship and Community Support programs, and learn about electrical safety.

Find out everything there is to know about 'Electrical Service' by clicking on the link at the top or right hand side of every page. Information on everything from new service to right of way, to new construction, to understanding your power bill can be found here. Also learn about service reliability, power disturbances, and how to make a damage claim.

Visit the 'Energy Info' pages and find out the best way to save energy. This is so important because it can help you manage your usage which, in this time of high power costs, is the best way to manage your power bill.
